

# South Hillsborough Pipeline



Tampa Bay Water is building the South Hillsborough Pipeline to meet the rapidly growing drinking water needs of southern Hillsborough County. Three routes are under consideration and will be ranked for approval in August by Tampa Bay Water's board of directors.

## Pipeline Facts

- Will carry up to 65 million gallons per day of additional drinking water to southern Hillsborough County
- Will provide a redundant water main to Hillsborough County's Lithia Water Treatment Plant to ensure water supply reliability
- Will connect to a new Hillsborough County drinking water facility at the intersection of Balm and Balm Riverview roads
- Approximately 25 miles long; 36-72 inches in diameter

## Schedule

- **Public input:** Summer 2022
- **Board selects top-ranked route:** August 2022
- **Final design complete:** Mid-2024
- **Construction complete:** Early 2028
